- 1. Appointment. The Chief of Police shall appoint Community Service Officers in accordance with the Human Resources Department rules and related contractual stipulations.
  - a. He/she shall report to the Community Service Officer Supervisor.
  - b. He/she shall maintain their assigned schedule.
- 2. The Community Service Officer (CSO) shall wear the Department authorized CSO uniform while on duty. CSO's shall report for work in a clean and neat uniform.
- 3. Duties and Responsibilities. The Community Service Officer shall:
  - a. Have knowledge of and obey all policies, procedures, rules, regulations, orders and directives pertaining in general or specifically to community service officers.
  - b. Check E-mail, Voice Mail, and all other assigned mailboxes at least once each workday.
  - c. Report for work on time, and maintain a regular and predictable attendance history.
  - d. Maintain a valid Wisconsin Driver's License.
  - e. Successfully complete and maintain Humane Officer Certification.
  - f. Get along with and work well with others.
  - g. Write clear, concise, and accurate reports.
  - h. Work with computers and programs used by the Department.
  - i. Respond to and investigate animal complaints within the City of Racine.
  - j. Capture and remove stray, uncontrolled, abused, nuisance, or feral animals from undesirable conditions, using nets, nooses or other equipment as provided.
  - k. Issue municipal ordinance citations related to animal related violations.
  - I. Initiate and respond to parking violations within the City of Racine.
    - (1) Issue appropriate parking citation(s) to violators in assigned metered areas.
    - (2) Tow and impound vehicles when appropriate (tow away zones or suspended/non-registered vehicles.
    - (3) Issue appropriate parking citation(s) as observed within the City of Racine.
  - m. Work with the Patrol Division on animal complaints and parking violations.
  - n. Have knowledge of applicable laws and ordinances of State of Wisconsin and City of Racine and the ability to research and apply them.
  - o. May perform the duties of a crossing guard and traffic control as assigned.
  - p. Perform other duties as assigned.
