POLICY

To coordinate and control police activity at the scene of an emergency operation.

PROCEDURE

When an emergency operation occurs, the following steps shall be taken:

MEMBER

Respond to the scene as directed.

SUPERVISOR

- 1. Respond immediately to the scene.
- 2. Establish an on-site command post.
 - a. In an area of safety.
 - b. In visual contact of the disaster area, only if it can be safely accomplished.
 - c. In a readily accessible location.
 - d. Designate its location by use of a green light.
- 3. Advise Dispatch of the Command Post location and advise who the Incident Commander is.
- 4. Request and oversee the assignment of manpower and equipment needed.
- 5. Request notification of the Shift Commander.
- 6. Advise Dispatch of the need (if necessary) to use alternate channels for emergency operations-related radio traffic.
- 7. Utilize the Incident Command System as appropriate (The Command Board and RPD ICS Manual in Supervisor vehicles may be of assistance).
- 8. Consider the use of CodeRed and IPAWS to support operations. Assign or delegate the use of the system as needed, to include requesting support from shift commander.

SHIFT COMMANDER

- 1. Confer with the on-scene supervisor to determine the extent of the emergency operation and the Departments' involvement.
- 2. Notify the appropriate commanders as necessary per Department procedures (Policy #212).

NOTE

If an On-Site Command Post has already been established by another emergency service, the supervisor shall cooperate in the direction and control of police services from that Command Post, if practical.
